Minims<sup>®</sup> Oxybuprocaine hydrochloride 0.4% eye drops 0.5ml unit dose Minims<sup>®</sup> Proxymetacaine 0.5% eye drops 0.5ml unit dose Tier 3 – medium impact\* Date of issue: 22/08/2023 Link: Medicines Supply Tool

### Summary

- Minims<sup>®</sup> Oxybuprocaine hydrochloride 0.4% eye drops 0.5ml unit dose and Minims<sup>®</sup> Proxymetacaine 0.5% eye drops 0.5ml unit dose are in limited supply until early October 2023.
- Where stock is unavailable, unlicenced supplies of proxymetacaine 0.5% eye drops 10ml (contains preservative: benzalkonium chloride) may be sourced, lead times vary.
- Minims<sup>®</sup> Tetracaine Hydrochloride 0.5% w/v and 1% w/v eye drop solution remain available but can only cover normal demand.

### Actions Required

Clinicians/prescribers should:

- reserve stock of Minims<sup>®</sup> oxybuprocaine hydrochloride 0.4% and Minims proxymetacaine 0.5% for urgent procedures, patients who require preservative-free formulations, and for children;
- where there are insufficient stocks available consider prescribing unlicensed proxymetacaine 0.5% eye drops 10ml (contains preservative, benzalkonium chloride) ensuring that the patient is not intolerant to any of the excipients. Clinicians should work with local pharmacy teams to ensure orders are placed within appropriate time frames as lead times may vary (see Supporting Information below).

## Supporting information

#### **Clinical Information**

Minims<sup>®</sup> Oxybuprocaine hydrochloride 0.4% and Minims<sup>®</sup> Proxymetacaine 0.5% are both used as ocular anaesthetics.

Imports of proxymetacaine hydrochloride 0.5% eye drop solution have been sourced. This presentation contains the preservative benzalkonium chloride, which may cause hypersensitivity reactions.

Guidance on ordering and prescribing unlicensed imports

- Target Healthcare have confirmed they can source unlicensed proxymetacaine hydrochloride 0.5% eye drops solution (10 x 10ml) (please note there may be other companies that can also source supplies):
