

Summary of RCOphth 2024 clinical leads survey

Between January-February 2024, The Royal College of Ophthalmologists conducted a survey of ophthalmology clinical leads based in NHS ophthalmology departments based across the UK.

The survey asked questions relating to:

- the ability of departments to deliver a service that meets the needs of patients in their area
- the extent to which services delivered by department are well-integrated with other parts of the eye care pathway
- the impact of independent sector providers on ophthalmology services.






